While we are proud of what we have accomplished together, our work is just beginning. We have only scratched the surface, and there is much more to do. Expanding our reach and developing sustainable solutions are critical to helping families navigate crises and achieve lasting stability. In 2023 and 2024 we reached more than 200 individuals and families, including 12 families we supported while navigating their child welfare challenges. This is only a drop in the ocean of child welfare related cases we can help families navigate.

Client Story: A Journey of Resilience



There are no words that can fully capture the gratitude we feel for Color me SAFE Foundation and the incredible support, dedication, and empathy they showed us during one of the most difficult, unimaginable times of our lives. When both of our children were taken from us by CPS and we were left with no contact, no guidance, and no idea of how to navigate the overwhelming system, we were devastated. It felt as though our lives had been turned upside down in the blink of an eye, like a tsunami had hit us, and we were left with no clear path forward.

Then, by the grace of God, we were referred to Gauthami, and she became a true blessing in our lives. We can honestly say we would not be where we are today without her unwavering support. From the very first conversation, Gauthami and her team—especially Britany—showed us a level of care and compassion that was beyond anything we could have hoped for during such a dark time.

Britany took the time to explain the complexities of the CPS system in a way that was clear, understandable, and manageable. She guided us through every stage of the process, helping us to understand the small, seemingly minute things that could make a huge difference in our case. The parenting strategies she recommended were invaluable and helped us better understand how to meet CPS expectations and navigate the many red flags that might arise. Britany's insight and expertise made all the difference, and we followed her advice closely, knowing that each decision could be the one that tipped the scales in our favor.

Gauthami, in particular, is an incredible woman. She is a true force of nature, and the world needs more people like her—people who have chosen to dedicate their lives to helping others selflessly and unconditionally. She was there for us every single step of the way, answering our calls, responding to our messages, and offering advice whenever we needed it, no matter the time of day or night. To us, Gauthami is like a guardian angel. Her commitment to our family was unwavering, and her support gave us the strength to keep pushing forward, even on the days when we felt like giving up.

One of the most powerful lessons we learned through **Color me SAFE Foundation** came from a simple but profound analogy Britany shared: "It's like rolling a ball up to the peak of a mountain. You have to be careful that the ball doesn't roll back down to the other side, because one small mistake could undo everything." This analogy stuck with us throughout the process. It reminded us to stay focused, stay disciplined, and stay the course, because every step we took was crucial in the long journey of reunification. It was constant, thoughtful, and meticulous work—and we owe our success to their guidance.



Today, after six long months of navigating the CPS system with **Color me SAFE** Foundation's unwavering support, our children are finally back with us, and we could not be more overjoyed. We are ecstatic, relieved, and forever grateful. The transformation in our family has been nothing short of miraculous, and it wouldn't have been possible without Gauthami and Britany's tireless help.

What's even more incredible is that, through the course of this journey, CPS themselves have praised us for being the best parents they have seen in the system. They were not able to prove the initial concerns they had, and instead, they commended us for our dedication, commitment, and the progress we made. That is a direct result of the knowledge, tools, and emotional support we received from **Color me SAFE** Foundation.

We have learned so much from this experience—not just about the CPS system, but about ourselves and what it means to be a resilient, loving family. We truly believe that Gauthami and her team saved our family. Gauthami always reminded us, there is light at the end of the tunnel. We will be forever grateful for their unwavering support that helped guide us through.

Overview of Color me **SAFE** Foundation

Color **me** **SAFE** Foundation began operating in mid-2023; however, its roots go back to 2013 when Color me SAFE, LLC was established to empower and educate families and communities on matters of child welfare. Our mission is centered around advocacy, consultation, and guiding families through the complex and often overwhelming system of Child Protective Services (CPS). With a small but dedicated team that boasts over forty years of combined experience in child welfare, particularly within CPS, we work directly with families, family law attorneys, nonprofits, schools, daycares, and the broader community.

At Color **me** **SAFE** Foundation we are committed to ensuring that no family faces a child welfare crisis alone. While the child welfare system is designed to protect children and strengthen families, it often falls short—especially for those who lack the knowledge, financial resources, or specialized assistance to navigate its complexities. These systemic shortcomings can lead to unnecessary trauma, wrongful separations, and further victimization, leaving families feeling helpless and unheard - deepening their existing crisis.

But child welfare is far more than just protecting children from abuse and neglect—it encompasses every aspect of a child's emotional, mental, and physical well-being. True child welfare means ensuring that children grow up surrounded by love, safety, stability, and the joy of learning. It is the comforting embrace that soothes, the steady hand that guides, and the attentive ear that listens. It is about celebrating their successes, standing by them in times of struggle, and ensuring that every child has the support to write their own story—one filled with hope, health, and personal growth.

Our foundation bridges these gaps by advocating for families, equipping them with essential tools, and strengthening both children and families while helping them navigate the child welfare system and preventing potential crises. Our team of trained professionals—including former Child Protective Services (CPS) specialists, child welfare experts, and family advocates—brings firsthand knowledge and strategic guidance to families in crisis.



What We Do

Our foundation focuses on three primary programs: Direct Family Consultations, Parenting Strategies Program, and Education & Awareness.

Direct Family Consultations



We offer families practical guidance and support when they are facing a child welfare crisis. Our team helps those dealing with ongoing CPS cases, provides support to survivors of domestic violence where children are involved, and advocates for families navigating difficult divorce and custody disputes. Our goal is to empower families with the knowledge and resources they need to protect their children and make informed decisions.

Guiding Families:

Helping families assess whether to contact CPS with concerns about a child's well-being and providing them with an understanding of what to expect after making the call.

CPS Investigation Guidance

Advising families on how to navigate the process once CPS opens an initial investigation. We guide them on how to respond, what questions to ask, potential outcomes, and how to appeal if necessary.

CPS Case Review:

Reviewing CPS case documents and providing families with a detailed analysis to help them understand the complexities of their case, determine whether to appeal, and potentially have their case overturned.

Domestic Violence Support:

Assisting victims of domestic violence who have children at home, ensuring the safety and well-being of the entire family.

Reunification Support:

Offering step-by-step guidance to families whose children have been removed and placed in state conservatorship, helping them understand the actions needed for reunification.





Parenting Strategies Program

Our program equips parents and families with customized guidance and evidence-based strategies for safe parenting, co-parenting, and resolving parent-teen conflicts. Tailored to meet the unique dynamics of each family, this program fosters healthier relationships, enhances communication, and ensures the emotional and physical well-being of children and teens during challenging times. Our parenting strategies program typically consist of 6-8 hours of individual work sessions with each family, individually tailoring initiatives and strategies to their specific needs.

Education & Awareness

We provide workshops, safe spaces, and training sessions on key topics like child welfare, domestic violence, mental health, and navigating the CPS system. Our sessions are offered to families, schools, daycares, and community groups. We partner with institutions such as schools, daycare centers, therapists, and other nonprofits that work directly with children and families to ensure the trainings are impactful and relevant.



Training survivors of domestic violence

Training survivors of domestic violence on how to navigate the landscape of child welfare, co-parenting, CPS, and working with family law attorneys.

Training therapists

Training therapists on understanding the landscape of CPS, such as understanding how a CPS investigation works from the beginning to the closing of the case.

Providing educational sessions

Providing educational sessions to the public on effective co-parenting, and intervention, and understanding the signs of abuse and neglect.

Educating immigrant and refugee families

Educating immigrant and refugee families to help them understand the child welfare laws of the State of Texas.

Organizing sessions to empower and educate

Organizing sessions to empower and educate South Asian families and their children to better navigate the unique challenges they face when managing dual cultural identity and integrating into American society.

Organizing and participating in events to raise awareness about child welfare

Organizing and participating in events to raise awareness about child welfare, including an annual community event for Child Abuse Prevention Month with Charities2Love and speaking at community events in collaboration with other nonprofits.





Case Example: Our Education & Awareness initiatives with the **DFW** **South Asian Community**

Recognizing the unique needs of the South Asian community and inspired by our Founder's personal experience, we launched three key initiatives: **'Hey SAATHI!'**, **'Ask Auntie!'** and a partnership with University of Texas Dallas-UTD **MannMukti**, a student-led organization whose mission is to destigmatize mental health in the South Asian community.



Hey SAATHI¹

Hey SAATHI's vision is to educate and support South Asian families—whether they have children or not—in navigating the everyday conflicts that arise from their immigrant experience. Through regular discussion groups, we explore a wide range of topics, including generational gaps, cultural identity, child welfare, mental health, domestic violence, self-care, and more. This program empowers parents with the knowledge and tools needed to address and overcome shared challenges while fostering a supportive community for open dialogue and growth.

Ask Auntie!

Ask Auntie²

Ask Auntie's vision is to provide South Asian students entering middle and high school with a nurturing nonjudgmental environment. The aim is to create a supportive space where students of similar ages and backgrounds can connect, share, ask questions, and address their concerns, fostering open communication and sense of community as they transition through their teenage years.



¹ **SAATHI** means "Friend" in Hindi and many other Indian languages, and additionally **SA** (South Asian denotes our community), **A** (Advocacy highlights the group's role in advocating for and supporting South Asian families), **T** (Togetherness reinforces importance of community support and uplifting one another), **H** (Health family underscores the commitment to fostering family resilience and unit admits the journey of cultural integration.), **I** (Integration of South Asian Families into Western society while maintaining their cultural identity. It encompasses the efforts to help these families blend their Eastern cultural heritage with their lives in America, promoting a balanced coexistence of both cultural worlds.

²**Auntie stands for:** **A (Authentic):** Emphasizing our empathetic approach, we strive to fully comprehend the unique challenges and experiences of South Asian children and teens. This understanding forms the basis of our guidance, ensuring it is relevant and meaningful to everyone. **U (Understanding):** This represents the genuine and sincere approach we take in engaging with students. The initiative is rooted in honest and open communication, where our children and teens can express themselves freely in safe space and receive support and advice that is true to their personal experiences. **N (Nurturing):** Our approach is caring and supportive, aiming to foster growth and resilience in our children. We provide guidance that helps them not only navigate current challenges but also equips them with skills and confidence for their future. **T (Trustworthy):** Building trust is at the core of the "Ask Auntie" initiative. Students can confidently share their thoughts and concerns, knowing they are in a safe and confidential space, and non-judgmental space. Our commitment to trust ensures that students feel secure and supported. **I (Inclusive):** The initiative is welcoming to all South Asian students/teens, regardless of their specific cultural backgrounds, beliefs, or experiences. We embrace diversity and ensure that every student feels included and respected. **E (Empathetic):** At the heart of the "Ask Auntie" initiative is empathy. We strive to deeply understand and connect with the emotions and experiences of our children/teens, ensuring that our guidance is compassionate and considerate.



MannMukti Partnership



MannMukti

Through this partnership, we provide small group therapy for South Asian students, helping to address mental health challenges and reduce stigma within South Asian community. These initiatives create a supportive, community-driven space for families and youth to connect, share, and grow together.

The topics addressed in these groups cover a wide range of issues relevant to the South Asian community and beyond. Participants engage in discussions on cultural/self-identity, mental health, bullying, cultural gaps, self-esteem, LGBTQ+ issues, academic pressures, dating, and many more. These conversations are designed to provide support and guidance on navigating complex challenges while fostering resilience and personal growth.

Typically, a group size of 12 to 15 attendees provides an ideal environment for fostering meaningful interactions, conversations, and ensuring that each participant receives the attention and support they need. This group size allows for a balanced dynamic, promoting engagement while maintaining the intimacy required for effective healing and empowerment.

Support groups like 'Hey SAATHI!', 'Ask Auntie!', and Small Group Therapy in partnership with MannMukti play a vital role in both child welfare and mental health. These groups create safe, culturally sensitive spaces where individuals can share their experiences without fear of judgment. By reaching underserved communities directly, they help bridge gaps in accessibility, ensuring more families receive the support and resources they need.

In the child welfare space, these groups are essential for supporting families in crisis, offering guidance on navigating complex systems and reducing the emotional toll often associated with child welfare interventions. They help break the cycle of trauma by providing peer support, practical tools, and the wisdom of lived experiences. This reduces isolation for both parents and children facing personal and cultural challenges.

Through open, normalized conversations and culturally appropriate guidance, these initiatives foster resilience, strengthen community connections, and enhance overall well-being. By preventing or mitigating family crises, they promote long-term stability, empowerment, and a healthier future for both children and families.



Our **IMPACT**



Color me SAFE Foundation is driven by a deep commitment to equity and justice. Every family deserves a voice, advocacy, and access to resources—regardless of their background, economic means, or cultural identity.

At **Color me SAFE Foundation**, success is not just measured in numbers—it's measured in the families we help keep together, the parents we empower, and the children we help protect. Each case we take on is approached with care, thoughtfulness, and individualized guidance, ensuring that solutions are tailored to the unique dynamics of each family's situation.

We invest the time necessary to navigate complexities, provide informed recommendations, and offer meaningful support, recognizing that no two families face the same challenges. Through compassionate support, expert guidance, and community collaboration, we are creating a future where every family has the opportunity to thrive, not just survive.

Direct Family Consultations and Case Analysis:

During this period, we supported 8 clients with a total of 50 hours through comprehensive consultations and case analysis at absolutely no cost for the families. These services provided critical guidance to help families navigate child-welfare crises, offering in-depth solutions tailored to their unique circumstances. Our support during active cases enabled families to address their challenges more effectively, promoting long-term stability and positive outcomes.



In addition to the primary service hours, our organization continued to provide several hours of emotional support and follow-up even after cases were officially closed. This post-case guidance ensured that families received consistent support during their transition toward stability, addressing any lingering concerns and promoting lasting positive outcomes.

Parenting Strategies Program:

We allocated 24 hours of direct service to deliver essential parenting strategies to 4 clients (families and individuals), also completely for free for the families. These strategies helped families navigate child welfare issues, provide guidance, solutions, and advocacy through divorce/custody conflicts, and resolve parent-child relationship challenges. Each client received personalized support tailored to their unique needs, fostering healthier family dynamics and promoting long-term stability. In many cases, sessions extended beyond their scheduled time, as clients had additional questions and concerns. Rather than limiting sessions strictly to allocated hours, we prioritize our clients' needs, ensuring they receive the thorough support and guidance necessary for their circumstances. This commitment reflects our deep level of care and dedication to empowering families with the tools they need to thrive.

Education & Awareness:

Our outreach efforts have been made possible by a dedicated team of volunteers, along with the invaluable support of those who train and guide them. These individuals play a crucial role in ensuring that our educational initiatives and group programs run smoothly and effectively. Together, they have organized and led groups and events throughout the DFW community, reaching over 190 individuals, including teens, children, parents, grandparents, and caregivers. Their commitment has strengthened our ability to provide meaningful support and resources to those in need



Ask Auntie!

Since launching in February 2024, we have established a total of 3 active groups. As of October 31, 2024, we have reached 46 teens through these groups. These groups are facilitated by volunteers who have been trained by the foundation to ensure high-quality support and guidance for teens.

Hey SAATHI!

Launched in April 2024, this program has reached a total of 63 attendees as of October 31, 2024. Currently, there are three active 'Hey SAATHI!' groups providing a safe, welcoming space for meaningful discussions. Led by trained volunteers, these groups ensure that participants receive consistent, non-judgmental, and compassionate support."

Small Group Therapy in Partnership with



MannMukti

Since its launch in February 2023, this program has reached 78 South Asian college students as of May 2024. These therapy groups are guided by a volunteer who is also a licensed Trauma Therapist and our Founder Gauthami Vemula - Queijo, providing much-needed emotional support to South Asian college students as they navigate unique challenges.

Our outreach has expanded beyond local efforts to serve families across Texas, thanks to increased visibility and engagement. Through community speaking engagements, public awareness campaigns, podcasts, television interviews, and digital content, we have reached both rural and urban communities, ensuring that families statewide have access to vital resources and information about our services.

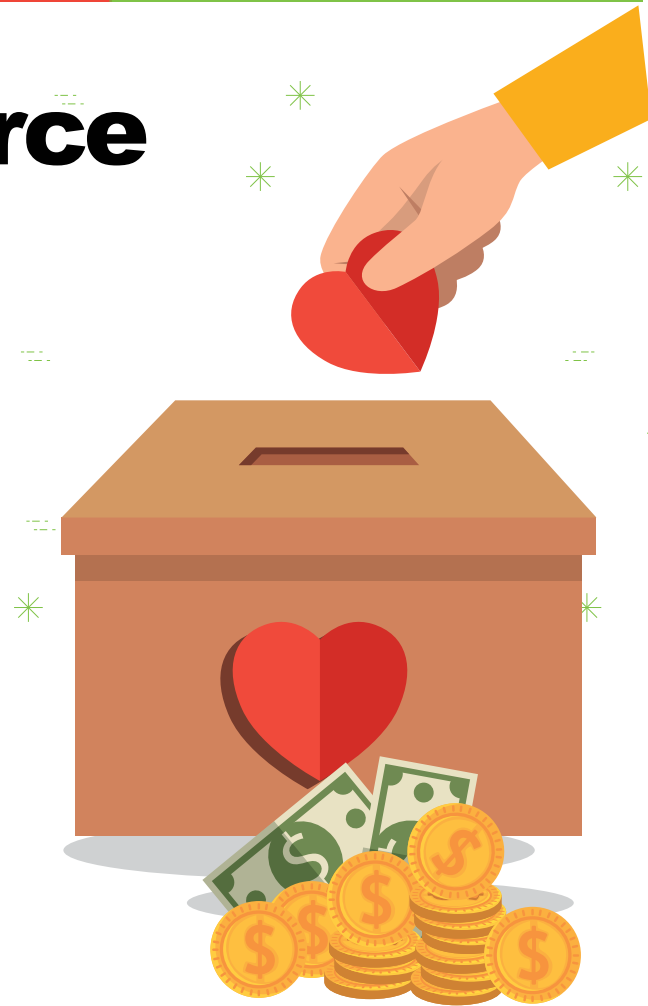

Funding & Resource Allocation

Fundraising

At Color *me* SAFE Foundation, every dollar received directly contributes to expanding our programs, strengthening our outreach, and providing critical support to families in crisis. Our 2023–2024 funding came from individual donors, grants, community partnerships, and grassroots fundraising efforts, allowing us to sustain and grow our impact. **Since starting our operation until the end of 2024, we raised a total of \$38,486 thanks to the generous support of our donors and partners.**

Our donors and partners' belief in our mission and commitment to child welfare and family advocacy reinforces the power of collective giving in transforming lives. Every contribution—big or small—helps create lasting change, and we are honored to have such a dedicated community standing with us.



The Power of Individual Giving



At Color *me* SAFE Foundation, we are deeply grateful for the generous individuals whose unwavering support fuels our mission. Their contributions have played a pivotal role in sustaining our programs, expanding outreach, and providing essential support to families in crisis. **In 2023 and 2024, individual donors made up the majority of our funding, in particular, we collected \$30,508 from 96 individual donors.**

In September 2024, we participated in North Texas Giving Day, raising an additional \$6,783. This incredible community support underscored the growing recognition of our work and the urgent need for continued investment in child welfare advocacy and family support services.



Community-Led Fundraisers



At **Color me SAFE** Foundation, we believe in the power of community-driven support. In 2024, we partnered with local community partners and friends that prioritize giving back and who came together to support our mission through fundraising events.

In January 2024, Coffee House in Dallas hosted a fundraising event organized by high school musical virtuosos who performed live and generously donated their performance tips to Color me SAFE Foundation. The venue also contributed by donating space and a portion of its proceeds, making this a true community-led initiative.

In August 2024, the Choudhury family transformed their housewarming celebration into a meaningful act of generosity by inviting guests to support Color me SAFE Foundation in lieu of traditional gifts. Their heartfelt gesture not only raised vital funds, but also introduced our mission to a wider circle—amplifying awareness and deepening community connection.

In September 2024, Hold My Chai in Frisco, a new local coffee shop, proactively reached out to support Color me SAFE Foundation, offering to donate the proceeds from their Labor Day 2024 sales. Their generosity and community spirit further strengthened our ability to serve families in crisis, demonstrating the power of meaningful partnerships.

These contributions have been pivotal in expanding our reach, ensuring that families facing child welfare challenges and crises receive the guidance, education, and advocacy they need. As we continue to grow, we remain committed to maximizing every dollar to drive meaningful change and build a future where families feel supported, empowered, and protected.



Costs

In 2023 and 2024 we used a total of \$8,356 to support our Mission:

\$3,950

was used to directly support families, either for direct family consultations or parenting strategies

\$431

was used to enable our Education & Awareness activities

\$2,200

was used to establish the foundation website and other technology infrastructure

\$1775

was used for other expenses, especially management training, marketing materials, and professional memberships

Our Financial Position

We ended 2024 with a total of \$30,130 available which enables us to continue delivering on our Mission in 2025. In addition, we plan to continue applying to grants and fundraise to expand our reach to additional families in need (see Looking Forward section).





Looking Forward: 2025 and Beyond



At **Color me SAFE Foundation**, we remain unwavering in our commitment to supporting families navigating child welfare crises. While we are proud of what we have accomplished in the last year, our impact is just a “small drop in the ocean” and we are now focused on rapidly expanding. In Texas alone more than 280 thousand cases were opened with CPS in 2024, and a large majority of the families impacted need the support of a resource like **Color me SAFE Foundation**. Our priorities for 2025 and beyond include expanding our marketing efforts to reach more families, launching a legal assistance program for families in need, launching a free child welfare support line, and expanding our Education & Awareness programs to other geographies through partnerships. These priorities will also require us to expand our fundraising efforts to enable us to fulfil our mission.

While we provide comprehensive guidance and advocacy, a critical gap persists—access to legal assistance. Currently, the Foundation lacks the resources to offer direct legal services, yet legal representation is often essential in safeguarding families’ rights at their most vulnerable moments.

In 2025, we aim to bridge this gap by partnering with local family law attorneys to provide free legal consultations and guidance in select cases. Many of the families we serve, including survivors of domestic violence and their children, lack the financial means to secure legal representation, leaving them vulnerable in both the child welfare system and family court. Without legal support, survivors face significant barriers in custody disputes, protection orders, and other legal matters critical to their safety and stability. These strategic partnerships will ensure families in crisis receive accessible legal guidance, empowering them with the knowledge to make informed decisions—without the financial burden of private legal services.

To further remove barriers, we are planning to launch a free child welfare support line, providing immediate assistance, answering urgent questions, and directing families to the right resources. This initiative will help us quickly assess cases and identify those requiring more in-depth support, seamlessly transitioning them into the Foundation’s full onboarding process.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to expanding our reach and amplifying our impact through our Education & Awareness initiatives. Strengthening partnerships with local organizations will enhance collaboration and ensure more families receive the support they need. Our efforts include expanding ‘Ask Auntie!’ internationally with select organizations. Currently, we are working with an orphanage in Uganda and in discussions with another orphanage in India to start ‘Ask Auntie!’ sessions, offering culturally responsive guidance to children—creating inclusive environments where children can find support, connection, and healing.

Through these initiatives, we are shaping a future where families feel empowered, protected, and supported—because when families thrive, communities flourish.
